

Car Parking in Blaby

Frequently Asked Questions

When will the charges be introduced and when will they apply?

On Monday 22 November 2010, Monday to Saturday inclusive between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm.

On which car parks will the charges apply?

Johns Court (Waitrose), Enderby Road (HSBC) and Wigston Road.

How much will it cost me?

The charging structure for Johns Court and Enderby Road car parks are:-

Up to 3 hours £0.10
Up to 4 hours £1.50
Over 4 hours £4.50

Wigston Road car park is £2.00 all day.

Is there any free parking?

No.

I live in Blaby where can I park my car and how much will it cost me?

On the car park nearest to where you live. You can apply for a residents parking permit which costs £50 per year and this exempts you from the charging tariffs. You need to fulfil certain residential qualifications and show copies of your Utility Bill or Statement, Tenancy Agreement, Water Rates or Council Tax, Certificate of Motor Insurance and initially applications will be limited to one per household. Holding a residents parking permit does not however guarantee a space.

I work in Blaby where can I park and how much will it cost me?

All three car parks are available. You can apply for a Season Ticket at a cost of £395 per year for Johns Court & Enderby Road car parks and £100 per year for Wigston Road. Season Tickets will be allocated on a first come first served basis and limited to one per person. Monthly tickets are available at a cost of £55 and quarterly tickets at £125. You can also pay by direct debit over 10 months for an annual ticket.

How will I indicate my length of stay on the car parks?

Either by displaying a ticket obtained from the Pay & Display Machines or by displaying a residents parking permit, season ticket or by using the parking disc permit (available from Blaby District Council).

Will the machines only accept cash?

No the Pay & Display Machines will also be able to take payments by debit or credit cards.

Will the charges apply on Bank Holidays?

Yes.

I am a blue badge holder, do the charges apply to me?

Yes if parked in a standard non disabled bay.

No if parked in a disabled bay and displaying the blue badge and clock for 3 hours maximum stay.

Will I be able to return to the car park?

Yes, but there is a no return period of 3 hours from expiry of the ticket.
